Scientists, dentists, and dental technicians are invited to submit their empirical/non-empirical original research results and/or case studies for the Oral Reconstruction Global Symposium poster competition. Posters can be submitted in the following categories:

- 1) Pre-clinical research
- 2) Clinical research (surgical and/or prosthetic)
- 3) Case report

The poster exhibition is open throughout the entire symposium. Authors can also apply for participation at the Poster Presentation Session on the main podium.

The symposium fee of € 580 will be waived for each main author whose poster is accepted.

POSTER REGISTRATION

To register posters, please submit your abstract **online by 31 January 2018**. Only original work in English will be accepted. The poster committee will review each abstract. Notification of acceptance or rejection of submitted abstracts will be sent to the corresponding authors by e-mail in February 2018.

The poster prize competition is independent of the selection for oral presentation.

POSTER PRESENTATION SESSION

FRIDAY, 27 APRIL 2018

Out of all applications, five will be accepted for oral presentation. The selection is made by the poster committee and not subject to discussion. The selected authors get 8 minutes of speaking time each during the symposium main program. The presentation needs to be held in English (speech and slides). Selection for oral presentation will be made at the end of February 2018.

Oral poster presenters are not automatically favored to win the poster competition.

AWARD CEREMONY

The award ceremony takes place on Saturday, 28 April 2018. The best posters from each category will receive a prize of € 2,000 each.

PUBLICATION

Selected posters will be published in the International Poster Journal of Dentistry and Oral Medicine as well as on the symposium and the Oral Reconstruction Foundation website.

The full text of regular abstracts will be published 10 days prior to the congress (16 April 2018) on the symposium website and app.

LET'S CELEBRATE KING'S DAY

THE HISTORY: FROM PRINCESS' DAY TO KING'S DAY

Originally, Princess' Day was celebrated in Holland on Wilhelmina's birthday (31 August), when she was still a princess. The feast involved many children's games and decorated streets. When Wilhelmina became the new queen after her father's death, it was changed to Queen's Day. Juliana, the next queen and Wilhelmina's daughter, celebrated Queen's Day on 30 April with a parade. Beatrix also celebrated Queen's Day on 30 April (her own birthday is in January), but contrary to her mother, she took her entire family and traveled around the country to visit several municipalities. King Willem Alexander has followed in this tradition. He was born on 27 April and this became the official King's Day in 2014.

THE CELEBRATION

King's Day is celebrated across Holland with the Dutch donning orange clothes and accessories ready to party. There are street markets everywhere. Tradition dictates that the Dutch Royal family visits one or two municipalities on this day. In addition to the street markets and music, King's Day tradition also calls for fun fairs. The celebration starts the day before on King's Night with music shows and parties.

THE COLOR: ORANGE

The Dutch royal family bears the name: House of Oranje. This literally means the color orange. As a result, it has become Holland's national color. On King's Day people wear orange clothes, often even donning orange wigs or make-up.

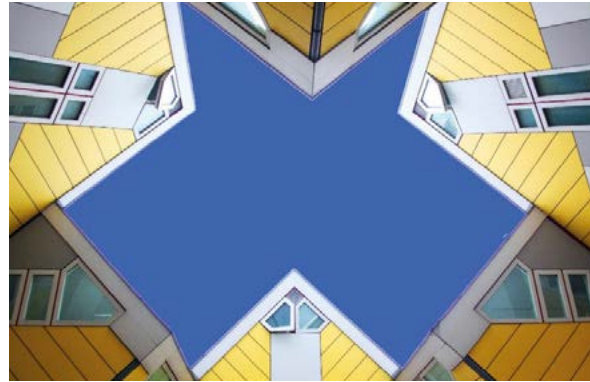

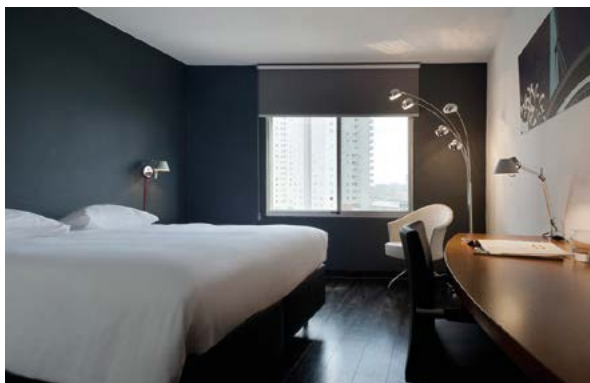

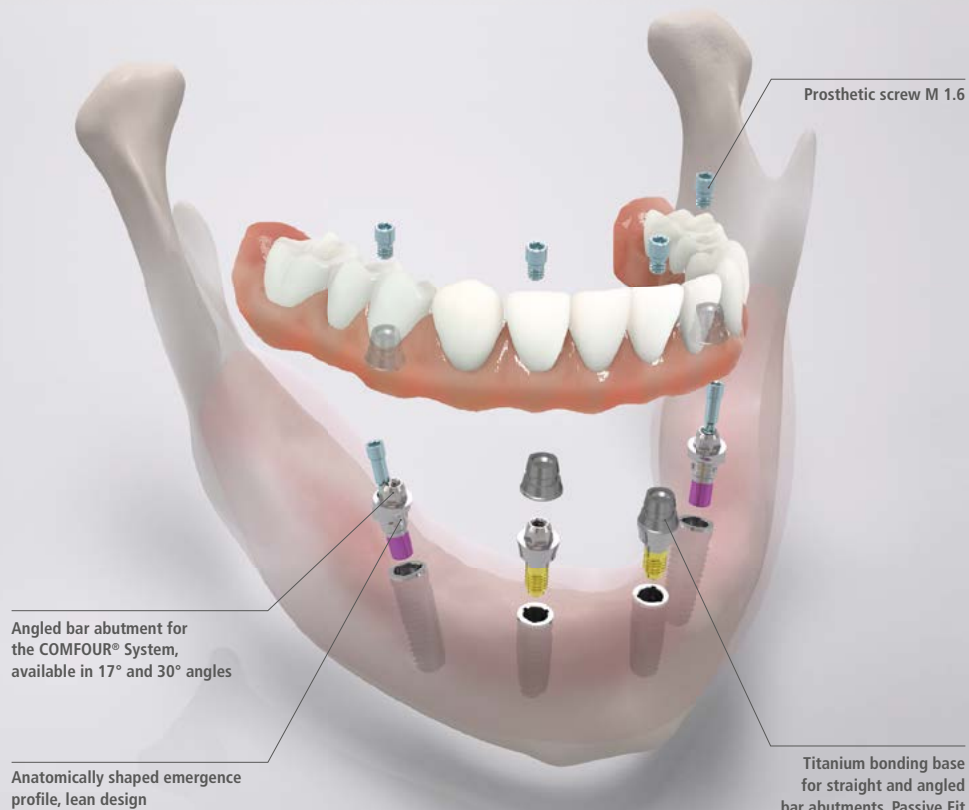
